Kurnell Battery Energy Storage System

Ampol is progressing its investigations for a big battery at the Kurnell Terminal site. A Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) typically consists of interconnected batteries in containers or buildings which are connected to the grid. Ampol's proposed BESS would charge in periods of low demand and discharge back to the grid when the electricity is needed.

At the end of 2023, following feedback from the Kurnell community and other stakeholders, Ampol submitted a Scoping Report and a request for Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARS). This step is part of the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure's State Significant Development application process. The SEARS have now been issued - they are project specific and identify what information needs to be included in an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). The project team is now preparing the EIS. We are committed to providing more details on this project to the community so that we can seek your feedback during the EIS preparation. In the coming months, we will send out a project notification, establish a website and hold a community information drop-in session in Kurnell. Ampol would like to acknowledge the Gweagal people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands where the Ampol Kurnell Terminal is located, and pay our respects to Elders past, present and emerging.

Terminal updates

Stormwater upgrades - the \$17 million project to provide increased protection against the potential impact of stormwater is progressing. This will include a total of 13 new pumps, two new pump pits and a levee wall to provide additional protection around the oily water system. This is scheduled to be completed by the end 2024.

Odour mitigation - enhancements to equipment and operational processes on the northern gasoline tanks will commence within the next three months. This will reduce the amount of waste which enters the oily water system and requires processing. In addition, the next phase of odour improvements will be a vapour extraction system at the oily water separators, to be installed in the next six months. More information will be provided in the next Community Update.

Wharf drain - relining of stormwater pits has now been completed and we are currently awaiting delivery of material to reline a 300-metre section of stormwater pipeline in the terminal. This program of work aims to mitigate hydrocarbon concentrations and odours being experienced at the wharf drain. Work is scheduled to be completed by mid-2024.

Quibray Bay - in late January, a team of independent mangrove ecologists and marine scientists, collected samples from the mangroves in Quibray Bay. This is part of a program of work to assess the health of the mangroves and advise next steps. The assessment will take approximately six months to complete.
